This workshop focuses on the architectural heritage of Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, with fieldwork serving as its primary activity. Addis Ababa has experienced remarkable urban development compared to many other African cities, and in recent years numerous large-scale development projects and high-rise construction projects have been undertaken throughout the city. At the same time, however, buildings and communities that have been formed over many years are facing the risk of being swept away by redevelopment. As a result, documenting architectural heritage and implementing preservation measures have become urgent priorities. During the workshop, participants will work together with faculty members and students from Addis Ababa University to conduct architectural surveys and interviews with local residents. Through these activities, they will investigate and gain a deeper understanding of the realities of the city's historic neighborhoods.
